

THE WAITUTU FOREST LODGE

The owners of the Waitutu Incorporation welcome guests to Waitutu Forest Lodge to go on a journey of discovery from the SILNA beginnings to where Waitutu is today.

The Lodge is nestled in one of the most spectacular and remote locations in the South Island of New Zealand - southern Fiordland National Park. It sits alongside the wild Wairaurahiri River and is within a few minutes' walk to the rugged South Coast. The location of the Lodge offers a perfect base for exploring the surrounding magnificence of the ancient Waitutu podocarp forest.

What it provides:

- → Six bedrooms with 21 beds (with pillows & duvets, linen can be hired)
- → Fully equipped shared kitchen/ dining with gas cooking
- → Fridge

- Unisex bathroom facilities with basins, hot showers, bath and flush toilets
- → Large drying cupboard
- Ample tables with bench seating
- → Radiator heating throughout the Lodge















THE WAITUTU FOREST

This outstanding dense podocarp forest sits at the forefront of the Lodge. It's part of the largest area of lowland coastal forest in New Zealand.

The forest contains rimu, miro, totara and southern rata, also kamahi, lancewood, ferns, orchids, etc. It provides a haven for wood pigeon, tui, bellbird, kaka and many other native species.

Dr David Bellamy (a prominent English Botanist) described the Waitutu forest as "probably the most important forest in the world".
